Introduction

The aim of this two day multi professional course is to enable participants to critically analyse and apply advanced knowledge in a patient centred approach to the care and treatment of individuals with a diagnosis of cancer. This includes cognisance of the overall treatment plan including diagnosis, disease staging, planning of therapy and the potential side effects of the cancer treatment. This course is being run by the School of Health Sciences in collaboration with the NICAN AHP group.

Who should attend?

This course is primarily for health care professionals involved in the management of people with cancer diagnosis.

Commissioning for registered AHPs and Nurses will be sought for this module and if obtained places will be allocated across each of the five Trusts. If you plan to apply for a commissioned place please contact your manager in the first instance. Self funded places will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Course Content

- Recognition of factors leading to the development of cancer
- Incidence and survival rates
- Cancer prevention, screening and health promotion initiatives
- Diagnosis and staging
- Principles of cancer treatment including radical, adjuvant and palliative therapies and encompassing surgical, systemic and radiation therapy
- New developments in cancer therapy and research, including the role of clinical trials
- The role of patient and public involvement in modern cancer management.

For clinicians completing assessment for credit points an additional study day will be offered combined with on-line support and module induction. Assessment for credit points will be 100% coursework.
